HOW MANY FINE ART DISCIPLINES MAY I CHOOSE?

Students may only select one fine art discipline.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD DOES NOT LIKE THE DISCIPLINE I CHOOSE?

Students in grades K through 2 may change disciplines each year. Students in grades 3 and up are locked into their discipline in order to build proficiency. In instances where it is determined that a child is truly not suited for a particular discipline, requests for change are handled on a case by case basis; however, they are at the sole discretion of the school.

Space in the various disciplines is limited, and the fine art program is staffed based on student enrollment in each discipline. Moving students from discipline to discipline at will can affect program availability for other students and staffing levels.

WHY ARE STUDENTS IN GRADES 3RD AND UP LOCKED INTO A PARTICULAR FINE ART PROGRAM?
